Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) is a collaboration among a public high school, a community college and a business partner. It gives a smooth and supported 6-year route from 9th grade to a career with potential for significant growth to regular and low performing students not just those scoring high on entry tests or doing well in 8th grade.
